Frequently Asked Questions - Chapter Success Grants

Who is eligible to apply?

Any officially chartered Ohio FFA chapter is eligible to apply.

What types of projects can be funded?

Projects will be considered that benefit rural residents or farmers, have a long-term impact on the community, and are in collaboration with a substantial organization. Projects should engage FFA members in service and service-learning activities to develop and expand leadership skills.

How much funding can a chapter receive?

Chapters are eligible to receive a maximum of \$5,000 per funding cycle year. Chapter funding requests should be for between \$1,000 and \$5,000. Funding requests may be approved for the full amount requested, approved for a partial amount, or not approved for funding.

What makes a strong application?

Successful applications clearly identify a need, outline a realistic project plan, show strong student leadership involvement in collaboration with a substantial organization, include measurable outcomes, and provide a detailed and appropriate budget.

Can a chapter submit more than one application?

Each chapter may submit one application that is written for one specific project per funding cycle year.

What expenses are ineligible?

Ineligible expenses may include stipends paid directly to students for their work on the project, travel expenses, and direct payments to other organizations.

When should the project take place?

All project activities should take place between June 1 and March 1 of the funding cycle year.

What reporting is required after receiving a grant?

Chapters selected to receive grant funding are required to submit a project completion report no later than March 15 of the funding cycle year. This report can be found here https://ohioffafoundation.formstack.com/forms/chaptersuccessgrants_completionreport.

Can grant funds be used for multi-year projects?

Yes. Projects may span multiple years; however, grant funds must be fully expended and measurable impact must be demonstrated within the specified funding cycle window.
